Throughout the day the students will participate in a number of individual events such as freestyle, backstroke and breaststroke. The carnival concludes with relay events where the house teams face off to try and win the overall championship. Points to teams are awarded for each event that a student swims in, extra points for a 1st, 2nd or 3rd and sportsmanship. Participation is the key. The more students become involved the more points they gain.

Students will need to remember that they need to be wearing a shirt, rashie, goggles, broad brimmed hat and sun screen.

The main carnival events are for students who have turned 7 years of age and older by the 1st January 2018. The students who have not turned 7 by this date will be engaged in a modified programme in the Primary unit. The Under 7 children will participate in an 'Early Years Splash Day' on Thursday 15th February. Details for this event was sent home with these children today.
