Next Friday 17th March is National Day of Action Against Bullying & Violence. The school is participating in the '1 Million Stars to End Violence' schools challenge.

The '1 Million Stars to End Violence' is a peaceful global weaving project that engages communities in a conversation about ending all forms of violence. 'Bullying No Way!' is promoting the challenge as a part of the 'National Day of Action Against Bullying & Violence'.

Our school is registered with a target to weave 500 stars. We will use the stars created to make an installation to display in the school. The stars will then be sent to Queensland to be a part of the 1 million stars installation by June. All classes across the school will be weaving stars towards reaching our target.

Students and families can also get a weaving kit including materials and instructions from the school's front office or classroom teachers so they can make a star together at home while also having the discussion about the commitment to end violence.

The school and classes will also participate in a range of class activities and lessons to focus on the impacts of bullying and violence and ways to help.

We are also hosting a star making session for families and community members in the community library between 2:00-3:00 pm on Wednesday 15th March if you would like to come along and show your support to the cause.
