## 2019 PARENT OPINION SURVEYS

Parents have recently been emailed with a link and survey code to access the 2019 Streaky Bay Area School Parent Opinion Survey online. All South Australian state schools are required to survey their parents, staff and students on the performance of the school over 2019. This information will be utilised to help improve the school and its programs into the future. All responses are completely confidential.

## NATIONAL COLLECTION OF DATA - SWD

All schools within South Australia are currently identifying students who require additional accommodation under the National Students with Disability Definition. This data is being collected by the Department for Education and will be used to build a national picture of students' needs across our schools. Whilst students who are identified will not receive any additional funding or support than they are currently, the data could influence future school funding.

## safeTALK

*suicide alertness for everyone*

During the half-day interactive workshop, participants learn 4 basic steps to recognise person with thoughts of suicide and help connect them to suicide helping resources. SafeTALK-trained helpers are important when it comes to suicide-safer communities and work alongside intervention resources to identify and avert suicide risks.

**Why attend safeTALK?**

Most people with thoughts of suicide extend an invitation for help. safeTALK training prepares you to help by using TALK (Tell, Ask, Listen, Keep Safe) to identify and engage a person with thoughts of suicide and to connect them to help. Anyone can attend, you do not need prior knowledge or experience in suicide prevention.
