END OF YEAR – START OF 2021 INFORMATION

Given the scale of the building work occurring during the Christmas holiday period and very tight timelines for the builders, Governing Council have approved the school using the unused School Closure on Thursday 10 December and the two unused Student Free Days on Tuesday 8 and Wednesday 9 December. This means that the **end of Term 4 for students will occur on Monday 7 December**. Governing Council are currently working to open the Vacation Recreation program early to provide care for families from Tuesday 8 December. To maximise time for the builders, the school will invoke its first **student free day** of the year at the beginning of the 2021 school term, **on Wednesday 27 January**, the first day of **Term 1 2021 for students will be Thursday 28 January**.
