The Middle School Maths vacancy continues to be advertised state wide and nationally. I also want to acknowledge SSO Jennifer Hekmeijer who has come to Streaky Bay Area School for this term to assist us to backfill Annie Picken and thank Mel Frick for her work in the Front Office during this time. Student Reports

End of Semester student reports went home to parent's yesterday afternoon, I encourage all parents to read the reports with their child/ren and to discuss their successes and identify areas that they could improve on next term. I understand that the NAPLAN reports for parents in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will become available early next term.

NAIDOC Week

NAIDOC Week (National Aboriginal and Islanders Day Observance Committee) occurs annually in July, and celebrates the history, culture and achievement of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC is

celebrated not only in Indigenous communities but by Australians all over the country and overseas. Today many of our classes participated in the Streaky Bay NAIDOC Week Family Day celebrations and activities at the Streaky Bay Institute, which were coordinated by the District Council of Streaky Bay and involved a number of different organisations from the Far West.

Student Free Days

The final two student free days for this year will be held in term 3, on Monday 5 of August and Friday 6 of September for staff to continue to focus on Differentiation and Universal Design Principals when programming and planning. The annual school closure will occur on Monday 9 of September. The Minister of Education has just announced that from 2025 to 2029 schools will continue to access the two additional student free days, on top of the mandated two student free days and school closure each year, to focus on curriculum development and the Pubic Education Strategy. This will mean that schools will continue to access four student free days per year and a school closure until the end of 2029.

Activities around the school

Middle School students competed in the SA Power Networks Robotics competition in Adelaide, coming runner up in the Engineering category – many thanks to Mr Redden for his support and supervision of this program and Mrs O'Reilly for also supporting the competition in Adelaide. Year 10 Outdoor Education held their local overnight bushwalking camp, hiking from Searcy Bay to Sceale Bay. Thanks to Mr Mc Taggart and Miss Fairclough for supporting these students on their walk. There have been a multitude of sporting events involving our students in the past few weeks which are detailed further in the newsletter.

End of term dismissal will be 2.05pm tomorrow, Term 3 commences on Monday 22 of July. I hope everyone has a chance to spend some restful time with their families over the July holiday break – please stay safe and warm.

SENIOR SCHOOL NEWS

As we reflect on the completed Semester 1, we turn our focus to the end of year exams. This period is not just about revising but also about managing stress and navigating the digital world effectively.

In a recent visit, Elevate Education highlighted the importance of early exam preparation. They recommend that practice exams begin well before the final exams, ideally 4-7 weeks in advance. This allows students to consolidate their learning and improve their exam techniques, even if not all topics have been covered in class. For example, if Topic 5 is pending, students can still complete practice exams for Topics 1-4, reinforcing their knowledge and building confidence.

To address the challenge of digital distractions, which include a vast array of social media and streaming services, Elevate Education suggested using tools like 'Self Control' for Apple devices and 'Cold Turkey' for Windows. These applications enable students to block access to distracting websites for set periods, helping them concentrate on their studies. They should be part of a balanced study routine where the internet is a reward during breaks.

Understanding the source of your child's exam stress is key to helping them cope. If they are overwhelmed by the volume of study, consider reducing their household responsibilities or suggesting a temporary halt to part-time work. Creating a study planner with them can offer a clear structure and a sense of progress as they complete each task.

Let's work together to support our students in starting their exam preparations early, using digital tools to their advantage, and employing stress management strategies to ensure they are well-prepared and confident as they approach their final exams.
