I hope you had a great school holiday break, students have returned and quickly settled back into their learning routines.

Staffing

This term we welcome Mr Kevan Varley, a highly experienced maths teacher who will teach our middle school maths classes for the first five weeks of this term. Mr Varley works for our Department's Fly In/Fly out Temporary Relief Teacher (TRT) program and we are delighted to have him teaching in our school for the first half of the term. TRT Maths teacher, Mrs Lidia Szlezak, who taught the middle school maths classes for the last half of last term, will return for the second half of the term. We are continuing to advertise for a replacement middle school maths teacher along with working with the SA Universities to fill this vacancy. Mrs Elliott will be on extended sick leave for the remainder of this year, we wish

her all the best, we are currently advertising for a teacher librarian.

Student Free Day

A reminder that Monday 5 August, next week, is the first of two student free days for this term. Staff will be continuing their work with the Support and Inclusion Team on differentiation and using the Universal Design when planning units of work and tasks for student learning. The second student free day for the term, and final for the year, will be held on Friday 5 September to continue this work and will be followed by a school closure on Monday 7 September after the Western Eyre Football and Netball league grand finals. The Royal Adelaide Show is also on during this extended break from school for families wishing to attend.

Governor of South Australia visit

Her Excellency the Honourable Frances Adamson AC, Governor of South Australia is visiting schools across South Australia during her term as Governor and will be in Streaky Bay on Wednesday, 14 August 2024. Her Excellency will be at the school from 9.00am to 10.00.am. The purpose of these visits is so that the Governor can promote and encourage discussions on civics and citizenship, her role as the Governor and leadership.

Her Excellency will be engaging directly with the state's young people, to learn firsthand of their ambitions and concerns, and to encourage and support them in pursuing their goals.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN reports for students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 were sent home to parents on Thursday last week. This was the second year of online testing that utilises adaptive tests that track student answers and adapt the test questions difficulty depending on correct or incorrect responses. Our students recorded good levels of growth across our classes, our teachers will be analysing our NAPLAN results to assist us to identify areas for improvement.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)

This week staff reviewed our student NCCD data, which identifies any learning adjustments that are made for students to assist with their learning. This data is submitted into the annual Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) and some school funding is tied to this. Students do not need to have a diagnosed disability to receive learning adjustments, however students receiving these adjustments do come under the National Consistent Collection of Data. Parents of students who receive learning adjustments and identified in the NCCD data collection will automatically be sent a letter alerting them that their child has been included in the data collection process.








MIDDLE SCHOOL MATTERS


SPANISH CORNER



The **Year 6** class has recently embarked upon an interesting journey exploring the continent of South America where most countries use Spanish as the means of communication. Alongside identifying the locations of individual countries on a map, students have learned the names of each country's capital city. Important geographical features such as the Andes Mountains, and the World Heritage site, Machu Picchu in Peru, also constitute part of the students' learning.

DID YOU KNOW.....?

Firstly, we invite you to attend the Year 9-11 Parent Evening on Tuesday 20th August at 7 PM in the staff room. This will be an opportunity to learn about Senior School and SACE as they move into the senior phase of their education.
