Staffing

Given tomorrow (Friday) is the end of Term 3, early dismissal will occur at 2.05pm. Term 4 commences on Monday 14 October, it is a nine-week term, with school finishing on Thursday 12 December.

Parent Teacher Interviews

Thank you to all of our parents and caregivers who made the time to attend our term/mid Semester 2 Parent Teacher Interviews. It was great to see all of our parents and caregivers in and around the school meeting with our teachers to find out how their children are going with their learning and development. For those who missed this opportunity, please contact your child's class teacher to see if they can make another interview time early next term.

South Australian Curriculum

Our Education Department is currently developing our own South Australian Curriculum which is based on and covers the current Australian Curriculum V9 requirements. The South Australian Curriculum is being designed to focus on three key areas, the development of student

dispositions, student capabilities and subject/content knowledge. The increased importance of developing student dispositions and student capabilities sets the SA Curriculum apart from other states in Australia. Next term our staff will begin to familiarise themselves with the SA Curriculum as it will begin to be phased into schools from 2025 to 2027.

No Hat, No Play

Term 4 and Term 1 pose sun exposure risks for our students when outdoors, to support good sun protection practices, the school has a No Hat, No Play policy for these terms. From the beginning of term 4 all students will be required to wear either a wide brimmed hat, or legionnaires style hat when outdoors for breaks or lessons. Please note that baseball/trucker style caps are not suitable, nor are hats with inappropriate advertising or messages (ie alcohol branding). Students who don't have hats at break times are required to play in the hard shade of the school buildings or go to the library, and may miss out on participating in outdoor lessons. Please ensure that your child/ren have an appropriate wide brimmed or legionnaires style had at the beginning of term 4.



Year 9 Students Tackle Food Waste: A Successful Audit and Future Plans

By Year 9 Students

Recently, our Year 9 students undertook an important project to address food waste at our school. Over the course of a week, they conducted a comprehensive food waste audit, engaging with classes, setting up designated bins, and meticulously weighing the waste collected each day. The results were eye-opening: a total of 18.93 kilograms of food waste was gathered, equivalent to the weight of 30 basketballs!

Why This Matters

Food waste is a significant issue for several reasons. Firstly, it represents a squandered use of resources such as water, energy, and labour that go into producing food. Secondly, when food waste ends up in landfill, it decomposes and produces methane, a potent greenhouse gas that contributes to climate change. By understanding the scale of our food waste, we can take meaningful steps to reduce it, thereby conserving resources and mitigating environmental impact.

Possible Upcoming Changes

In response to the findings, we will be working to introduce several initiatives aimed at reducing food waste across the school. Our initiative ideas include:

- Compost Bins: New compost bins may be placed around the school to encourage the proper disposal of organic waste.
- Food management Programs: We may launch programs to share or use excess food, ensuring that it doesn't go to waste.
- Educational Campaigns: Our students will continue to lead campaigns to educate everyone on how to reduce food waste, including tips on portion control, saving leftovers, and composting.

When enrolling in the program, you will need a Customer Reference Number (CRN) from the Family Assistance Office, which is linked to the Child Care Rebate (CCR) (formerly CCB) system. You can register for a CCR either online at www.familyassist.gov.au or by calling 13 61 50. To receive a reduced fee, you must be registered with Centrelink prior to the holiday program beginning.
