Staffing

YONDR PHONE POUCH RETURN

Students Year 6-12



At the start of the 2024 school year, all students from Year 6-12, were issued with a Yondr phone pouch to support the statewide ban on mobile devices in schools.

At the conclusion of the year, all students issued with a Yondr pouch are required to return their pouch.

The timelines are as below:

Year 11 students – Hand in Yondr pouch, Friday 29 November.

Year 6-10 students – Hand in Yondr pouch, Thursday 12 December.

Students leaving school earlier than the timelines above, are required to hand their Yondr pouch back on their final day of their school.

As communicated at the commencement of the year, each student was issued with a unique numbered pouch. Upon handing them in by the due date the number will need to match the pouch issued in their name. If the pouch is damaged, and or not returned the student will be issued with an invoice of \$35 and required to pay for a replacement pouch.

This information has been shared with the students and they are aware of the expectations and responsibilities associated with the phone pouches.

I ask parents and caregivers to speak to your child/ren to remind them of the Yondr pouch hand in requirements.

When school resumes in the 2025, the process will recommence as per this year.

MIDDLE SCHOOL MATTERS

Civics and Citizenship Workshop- Parliamentary Education

Last week, our Year 8 and Year 6 students participated in an engaging Civics and Citizenship session facilitated by the Parliament of South Australia's Community Education Program. The students explored various aspects of government, including the different levels of government, electorates, and elections. They also engaged in an activity that examined the responsibilities and significance of being a member of parliament.

An election simulation was conducted where students voted on a selection of dinner options using specific ballot papers. This exercise provided them with hands-on experience in conducting and counting votes. They were introduced to the structure and functions of the House of Assembly and participated in appointing students to roles such as officers of the Parliament, Premier, and Ministers.

Additionally, the students role-played the legislative process by debating a proposed law to ban homework in South Australia. This activity highlighted the role of the Legislative Council in the law-making process. Finally, the students discussed and recorded issues that are important to them, which will be shared with our Member for Flinders, Sam Telfer, to consider as significant concerns for our community.

Student Feedback:

"It was good because it was hands on and interactive and there were lots of activities."

"It was fun and structured really well, when are they coming again?"

"I learnt that you can't vote if you are sentenced to more than 3 years in prison."















SENIOR SCHOOL NEWS

I am pleased to inform you that, from 2025, our school will offer to its senior students a new and innovative Stage 2 SACE subject called Activating Identities and Futures (AIF). This subject has been successfully piloted in recent years and will be introduced throughout South Australia next year replacing the Stage 2 compulsory Research Project (RP) subject.

Building on the Stage 1 Exploring Identities and Futures (EIF) subject, AIF gives students a chance to explore an area of personal interest through a process of self-directed inquiry.

Schools and teachers involved in designing the subject were positive about the experience, and there were both immediate and long-term benefits for students. Students felt energised when they studied a topic of their own choice. They enjoyed stronger relationships with their teachers, took greater control of their own learning, and were able to transfer their new learning habits to other subjects.

Both the SACE Board and our senior school see AIF as an opportunity for young people on the cusp of adulthood to demonstrate initiative, show the world what they know and can do, and to set themselves up for where they want to go in life. These subjects are an integral part of a wider effort to ensure that SACE is a modern and responsive qualification for a changing world – a passport to thrive. As students start to think about what sort of subjects they want to study from 2025, we hope you will talk to them about their plans and what they might pursue as part of AIF.
