MIDDLE SCHOOL MATTERS

Building a Creative, Responsible and Inclusive Art Room

As we wrap up the first four weeks of the school year, our Visual Art students have been busy establishing safe, inclusive learning habits in the Art Room. We've focused on creating a positive studio environment where everyone feels comfortable expressing themselves and working collaboratively.

Engaging in drawing games, students have explored teamwork, creative risk-taking and coordination. For example, simultaneous sketching encouraged students to respond to each other's marks in real-time, fostering quick thinking and adaptability. Also, Bi-lateral Oil Pastel artworks challenged students to use both hands to create symmetrical designs, improving their focus and fine motor skills. As the majority of class members are focusing drawing practicals, small teams have also been developed to create videos to support the learning of Art Room habits for showing to their buddy classes in Week 7.

The Senior Art group embraced opportunities for experimentation with a variety of mediums in the first 4 weeks, becoming familiar with tools and materials available in the classroom and sparking curiosity. As Senior students, they are expected to manage their workspaces efficiently, both during class and when accessing resources during study hours. Therefore, experiences like these help them to grow independence in the studio environment.

Watch this space, as the Year 10 artists have embarked upon an Interior Design project where a room in the school will be reimagined in consultation with teachers and support officers. This is so exciting! Can you tell which room it is from these 'before' photos?



SSSSA Swimming Championships


On Tuesday, 25th February, Jayda Brougham and Banjo Burge represented Streaky Bay Area School at the prestigious SSSSA Swimming Championships in Adelaide, joining talented swimmers from across the Eyre Peninsula and Upper North. Competing against top schools and colleges from Adelaide, both swimmers delivered outstanding performances, showcasing their skills and determination on a larger stage.

Jayda had an exceptional day, finishing *second* in backstroke, *first* in breaststroke, and *second* in freestyle, narrowly missing first place by just a fingertip. Banjo also impressed, finishing *equal second* in backstroke, *fifth* in breaststroke, and *third* in freestyle, further demonstrating his competitive spirit.

In the overall team standings, the girls' team finished on top with a score of 725, while the boys' team placed sixth with a score of 592. The Eyre Peninsula and Upper North combined team placed *second overall* with 1,317 points, just behind the winning Westminster College.
